



December 17-Confessions in church Grades 3-8

Students in grades 3-8 will meet in church for Advent Reconciliation. Students will sit with their class and attendance will be taken. Parents must accompany their children in church.

Grades 1 and 2 are off on Dec. 17th.

Meaning of the Advent Wreath

Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest may wear rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.



OUR MOTHER OF GOOD COUNSEL 2024 - 2025 FINANCIAL REPORT

In this week's bulletin I am grateful for the opportunity to share with you this year's annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. It represents the strength of our Faith and the generosity of our Parish community. We are committed to being good stewards and fully transparent within our parish community.

Our Parish continues to grow and prosper, this year we ended with an operating surplus of \$21,488, that is an amazing accomplishment for a growing parish. Over the past seven years the total Sunday collections have grown by 48%, recovering from the deficit of covid, and this year increasing by 6.6% compared to last year. The Parish subsidy to Religious Education decreased from last year, while maintaining the integrity of our Catholic mission and the spiritual purpose of the program. Our Religious Education Director exercises wise stewardship over the program's finances with thoughtful planning and accountability. This past year we registered eighty-six new families which resulted in 321 new parishioners. Welcome to all our new parishioners!

We continue to do our best to be good stewards of the funds that are received throughout the year. Meaning that we spend within our means. That is evident by our parish having a surplus at the end of the year. We completed many projects across the parish, both easily noticed and those quietly carried out behind the scenes, affirming our commitment to being good stewards of the resources entrusted to us. The sound system, projectors, and screens were updated in the Church. The door security system was updated along with cameras. Unfortunately, in today's times this is extremely important, especially for the staff that may be working into the evening hours. The carpets were cleaned, walls have been painted, offices have been rearranged. A vesting room was made for the Priests and Deacons, prior to this room all the vestments were hanging in a hall closet, and vesting had to be done in the hall. That was unacceptable, especially when we have visiting Bishops and Priests. This new room is a welcome addition.

Our online donations through OSV continue to grow each year. We encourage everyone to explore this offering program. You can access the OSV online giving platform on our website at http://www.omgccc.org.

St. Joseph's Corner

Advent begins, not with activity, but with a hush. Long before the angels sang over Bethlehem or the shepherds hurried to the manger, God prepared the world for His Son through a man who would not have a single word recorded in Scripture: St. Joseph. Yet his silent readiness helped make way for a world soon forever changed.

In a world where noise is the default setting of our lives—marked by competing notifications, urgent messages, and unsolicited opinions—St. Joseph stands as a quiet giant. His silence is not emptiness, but a capacity carved out by God so that His Son could transform a broken world.

Making Room Before Making Progress

We often enter Advent with plans—devotionals, sacrifices, acts of charity, carefully scheduled holy hours. All good. Yet St. Joseph shows us a better path. Before he planned, he listened. Before he acted, he received. He made room—in his life, in his heart, in his soul—the room necessary for God's will to take hold, transforming both him and the world.

St. Joseph's greatness was not revealed in his words, his strength, or his determination, but through the interior landscape of a man who made space for God to act within him. His silence is not passive resignation; it is an active posture of receptivity, an intentional surrender of the noise of self-will, and an unwavering trust in God's providence.

In St. Joseph, silence becomes strength. Silence becomes discernment. Silence becomes fatherhood.

The Courage to Be Interruptible

Beginning with the Annunciation to St. Joseph, his life becomes marked by a series of holy interruptions—uprooting his own plans through dreams, angels, and mysteries he could neither predict nor fully understand. Each interruption required a surrender of something real: his expectations, his reputation, his comfort, and even his understanding of what God was doing.

And yet Joseph responded with a quiet courage that is easy to overlook. He allowed God to reroute his life without resistance. He allowed mystery to govern what had once been certainty. He allowed his story to unfold according to a will not his own—each time responding with a willingness that is startling in its immediacy.

This raises a question for us: Have we left any margin in our lives for God to interrupt us?

The noise we live with—a noise we often seek, choose, or prefer—doesn't merely distract us; it slowly forms us into a rigidity that cannot be redirected, surprised, or guided. Advent invites us to break down this scaffolding and allow God to form us into the masterpiece for which He created us (Eph 2:10).

The Interior Work of Advent


We often see the progression of our spiritual life as a series of efforts: doing more, giving more, adding more. But God does not need us to carve our own path of righteousness; He wants us to trust the path He has carved for us—a path that begins with surrender, not work.

Our instinct is progress. God's preference is presence. And presence requires room. St. Joseph's hidden strength was not in producing or planning but in making interior room for a God who works in quiet, slow, unnoticed ways—like growth in the womb, God's grace unfolds in the human heart (Jn 14:23).

Dear Brothers, take this first week of Advent as an invitation to clear out room for God in your life—not merely through outward expressions of good works, but by opening space within your heart for God to interrupt your plans, your expectations, and your pace of life.

Let God form you into the instrument of His will. Only then can you truly live out your vocation as husbands and fathers, preparing your family for the miracle to come

Baptism: Baptisms are scheduled on the second Sunday of each month. Polish Baptisms are at 1:00 p.m., and English Baptisms are at 1:30 p.m. Please contact the Faith Formation Office before booking your venue for the celebration. Parents must be registered with our parish. Both sponsors must be over 16 years old, with at least one being a practicing Catholic.



Marriage: The bride and groom should be active members of our parish. The couple should contact the Faith Formation Office at least six months in advance to schedule their marriage, allowing for adequate preparation. Schedule the church date for your marriage before securing your venue.



Funerals: The family of the deceased will coordinate with the chosen funeral home to make the arrangements. The funeral home will then contact the Faith Formation Office at Our Mother of Good Counsel (OMGC) to notify us about the upcoming funeral Mass. We (OMGC) will get in touch with the family and work together to organize the funeral liturgy.



Eucharist for the Homebound and Hospitalized: If you are unable to attend Mass please contact the Parish Office for the Sacraments of the Eucharist. Our Homebound ministry would be happy to assist you.



Anointing of the Sick & Hospital Visits: Please contact the Parish Office if your loved one requires an anointing. Please do not wait until death is imminent to request anointing, as it may take some time to find a priest for the sacrament.
